



FAQ - Coronavirus (COVID-19)

A guide for enquirers, applicants and offer holders to the MA Filmmaking programme at the London Film School.

Is the London Film School still open and running as normal?

Since Monday 18 March 2020, the London Film School has taken a number of measures in response to the on-going COVID-19 pandemic.

At present, correct as of 9 September 2020, we have re-opened our doors to new and returning students for the Autumn Term. Although we have re-opened our doors, this term will look and feel different to previous terms. As part of the measures we have taken to ensure the safety of our students and staff, we have introduced Blended Learning teaching to all of our MA programmes, and we have adopted strict social distancing measures on-site. Whilst we have re-opened our doors to students, visits to the School and campus tours remain postponed for the immediate future.

Our Professional Service staff, including Admissions and Student Recruitment remain off-site. Please be rest assured that our teams are well equipped to handle enquiries and process applications as normal despite the circumstances. What is Blended Learning and why has it been adopted?

To ensure we are able to teach our programmes safely, and in guidance with social distancing measures in place across the UK, we have taken the decision to alter some of our teaching delivery and introduced Blended Learning.

Blended Learning is a combination of in-person teaching and online delivery. Across our MA programmes you will be taught in this manner for the foreseeable future. This means you can expect the hands-on parts of the course to be delivered in-person, on- and off-site, under safe social distancing measures, mixed with online teaching, in the comfort of your own home.

All essential practical and hands-on classes will be continued to be delivered on- and off campus and in safe teaching facilities, however, to ensure we all adhere to social distancing measures, all non-essential in person classes will be delivered virtually.

For classes that do take place in person, we have introduced restrictions on class sizes, strict access to facilities and use of PPE, including facemasks.

As the pandemic progresses, the School monitors delivery options and continues to adopt the most appropriate and safe teaching methods where applicable.

Is the School still accepting applications for MA Filmmaking?

Yes, we are still accepting applications for our MA Filmmaking programme, with the next available intake being January 2021.

Have the application deadlines for MA Filmmaking also changed?

Yes, we have made a slight revision to our application deadlines for January 2021. All applicants now have until **Monday 5 October** to submit an application.

The deadline has been altered slightly due to demand and competition for spaces. Please note, that if we are not able to consider your application for January 2021, it will be considered for the next available intake.

What do I do if I can't submit an English Language Test as part of my application?

We understand many applicants have been impacted by on-going closures of English Language tests across the world.

As per our entry requirements, all applicants from non-native English-speaking countries are required to submit proof of English Language Proficiency to support their application.

However, in light of the current situation, applicants who would typically be required to submit proof of English Language will be able to submit an application and be given equal consideration for Interview without proof of English Language.

However, this is a **temporary** measure, and applicants must provide proof prior to any Unconditional Offer of Study being made.

Please note that we accept a variety of English Language Proficiency tests including IELTS, TOEFL, TOEFL online, Pearson's and Cambridge.

We advise all applicants for January 2021 to look at various English Language proficiency tests should their first choice not be viable.

What do I do if I can't submit my transcript from my home University?

We understand many applicants have experienced disruption from the closure of their home University and may not be able to provide final transcripts to support their application to LFS.

Any applicants who intend to apply for January 2021 but cannot provide a copy of their transcript are asked to email our admissions team at admissions@lfs.org.uk and our team will advise you on the next steps.

Are there any changes to Offers of Study given the circumstances?

We appreciate the current situation has caused disruption for many applicants, in many ways, which may affect their application for January 2021.

Any applicant who is unable to submit a relevant English Language Proficiency test, Academic transcript or references to support their application due to the current situation are advised to contact our admissions teams at admissions@lfs.org.uk for further advice.

Given the unprecedented circumstances we will consider conditional offers of study for those who are not able to provide documents as normal. However, this is a **temporary** measure, and applicants must provide proof prior to any Unconditional Offer of Study being made.

Have there been any changes to programme Entry Requirements?

There have been no changes to our entry requirements for either our MA Filmmaking programme.

Will there be any changes to the Interview process?

The interview process plays an important part of admissions to our MA Filmmaking, and we expect there to be no changes to this.

Applicants who are invited for Interview will receive invitations from our Admissions team as normal.

Can I still visit the School?

The school has taken the decision to scale back on-site operations and our central Admissions and Student Recruitment teams are now working remotely. The school is therefore closed to all prospective students and visitors for the time being.

All external events and campus tours have been postponed for the immediate future.
