MA

Filmmaking

An intensive two-year course that trains students to a professional level in a full range of filmmaking skills. Students leave with a portfolio of producing, directing, editing, cinematography, production design and sound credits.

Screenwriting

An intensive one-year programme that develops the writer's original voice, embeds professional practice and enhances employability.

MA Film Marketing

The one-year MA Film Marketing programme introduces students to all aspects of B2B and B2C marketing strategies for the film industry - from key art design and promotional trailers to media, publicity and social media plans.

MA International Film Business

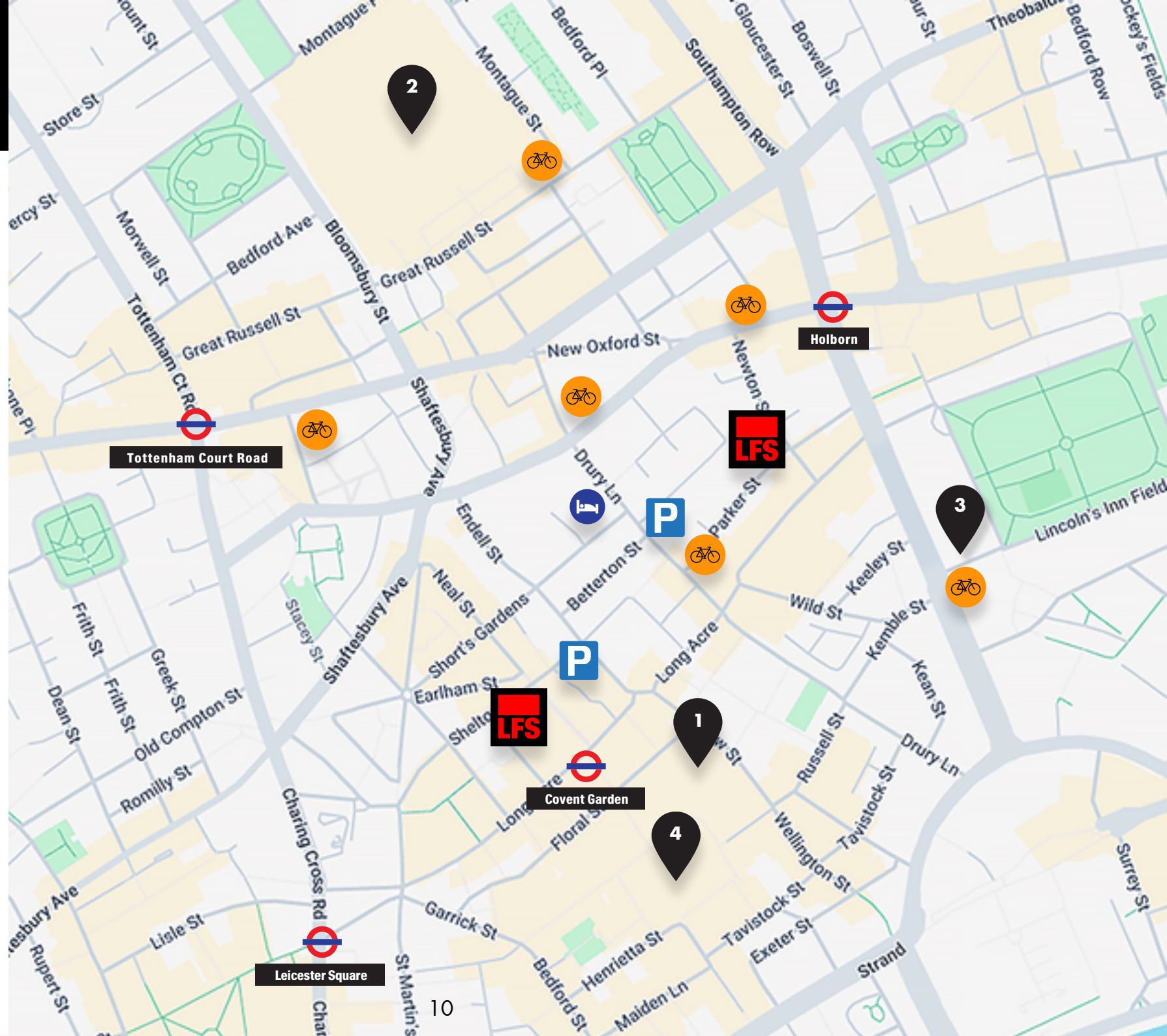

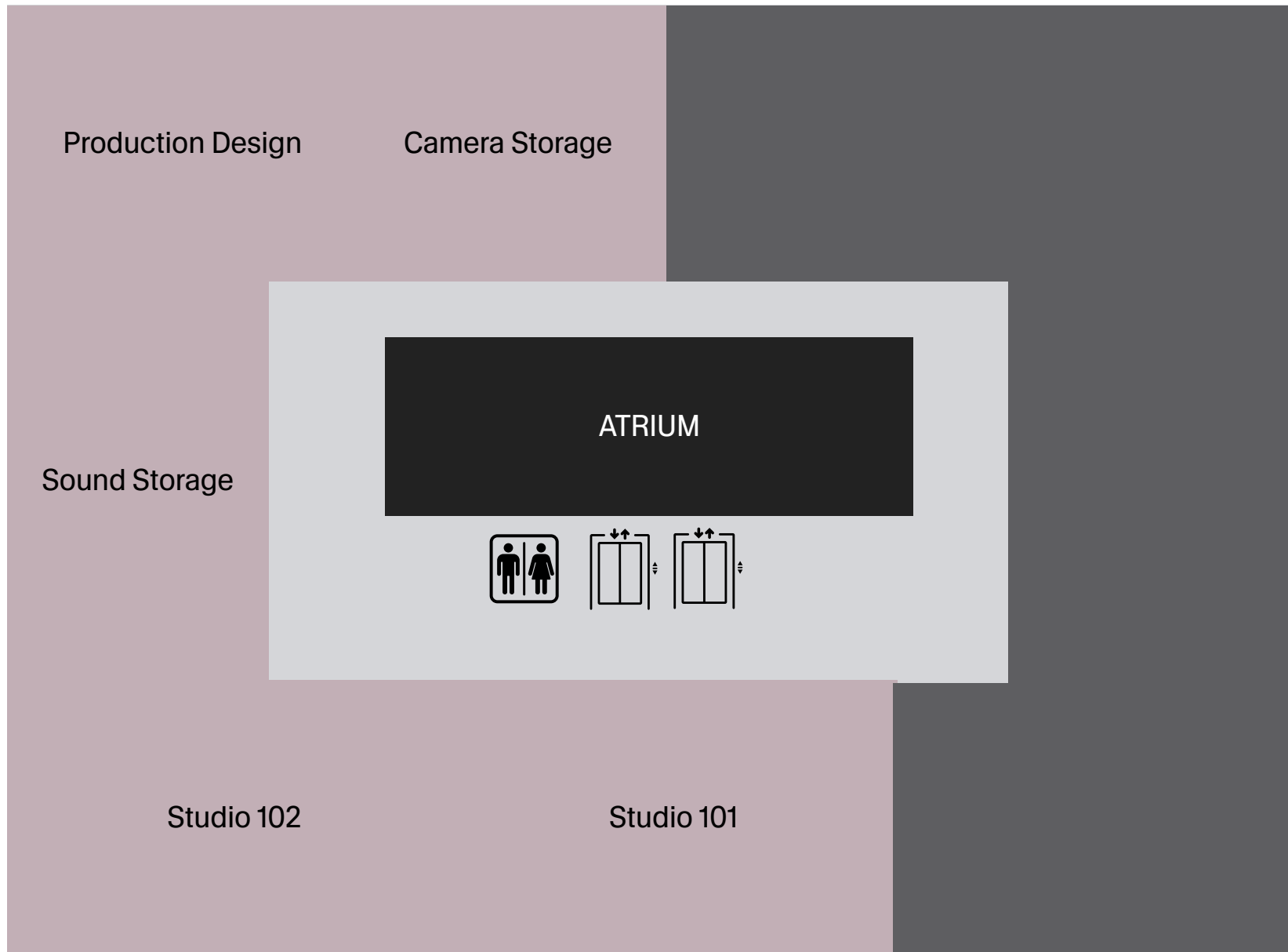

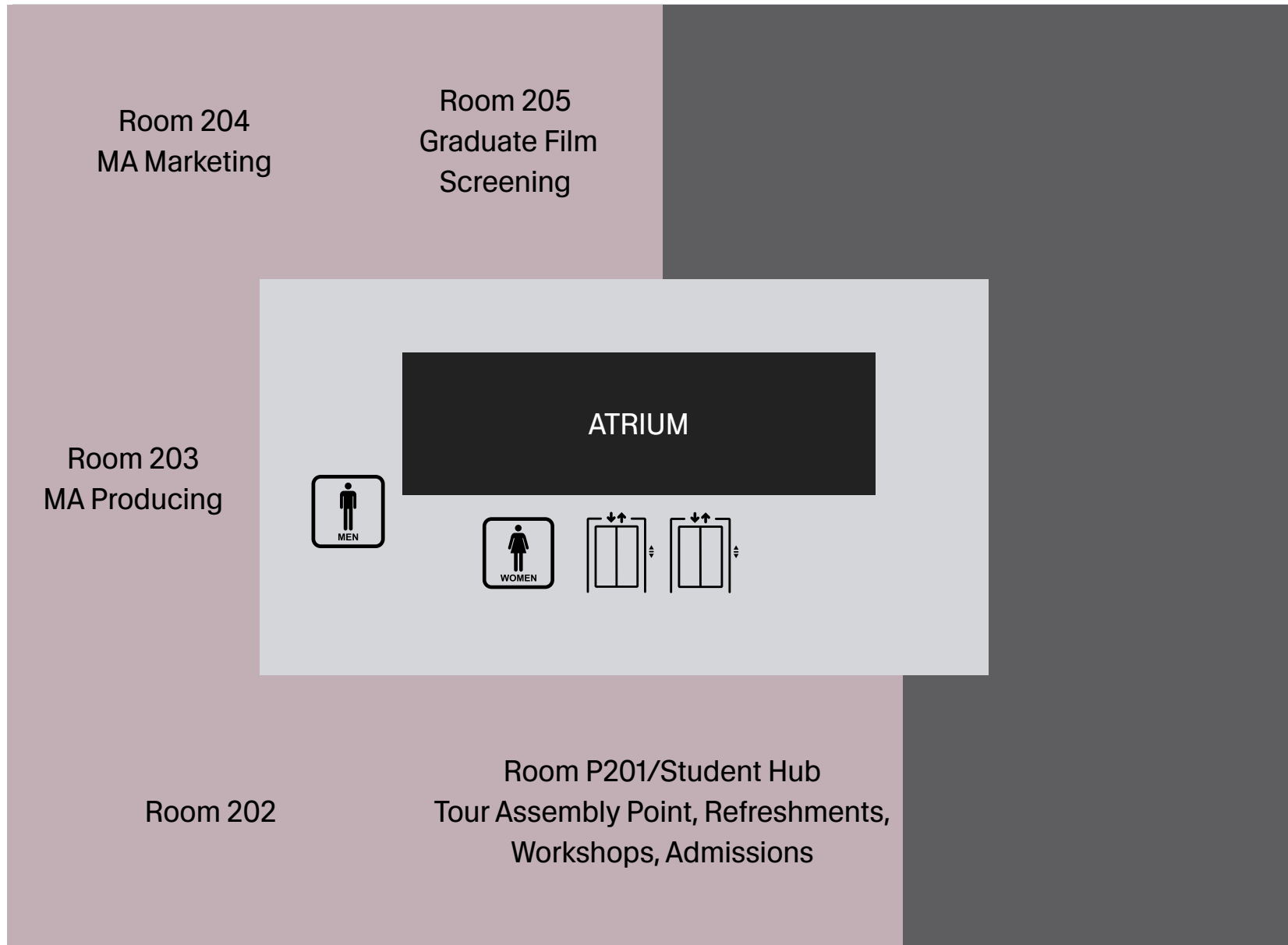

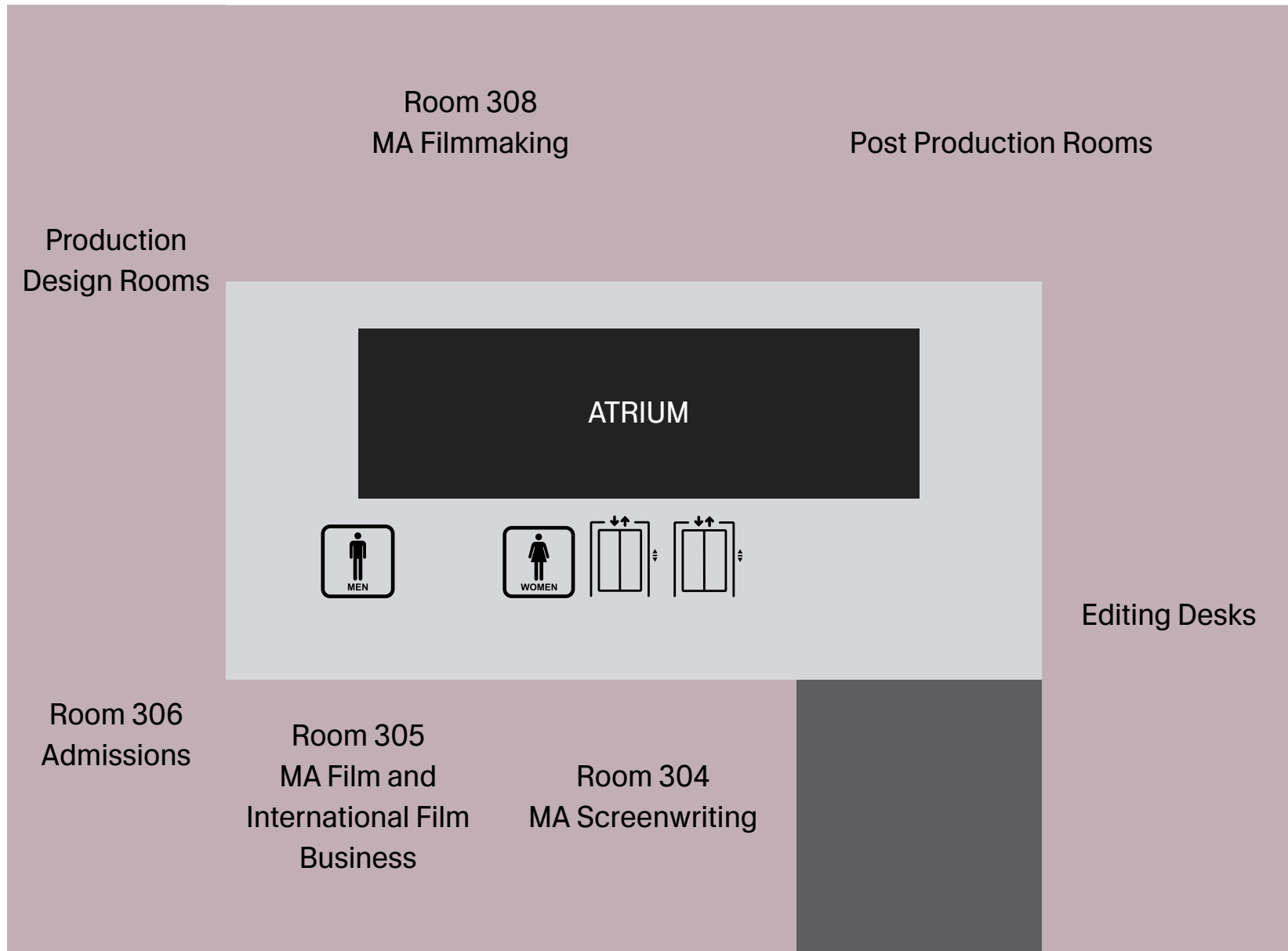

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the venue for the Open Day?

The address is London Film School, 39 - 41 Parker Street, London, WC2B 5PQ.

What are the closest tube stations?

LFS is within a 10-15 minute walk from the following tube stations:

- Holborn (Central Line & Piccadilly Line)
- Covent Garden (Piccadilly Line)
- Leicester Square (Piccadilly Line & Northern Line)
- Tottenham Court Road (Central Line, Northern Line & Elizabeth Line)

What are the closest train stations for mainline connections?

The following train stations are close but we would recommend using the tube, bus or taxi to reach the school.

- Euston
- Kings Cross St. Pancras
- Waterloo
- Charing Cross

What are the closest bus routes?

The closest bus stops are:

High Holborn Stop Q - Routes 8 and 98

Holborn Station Stop P - Routes 59, 188 and 243

Holborn Station Stop N - Routes 1, 68 and 91

What happens when I arrive at the school?

A team of student ambassadors will be waiting to welcome you to the Open Day. They will sign you in and help with directing you to your first activity whether that's a talk, tour, or one of the drop in sessions. You will be given a wristband on arrival and we kindly ask that you wear these during the event.

What can I expect at the Open Day?

Graduate Film Screening

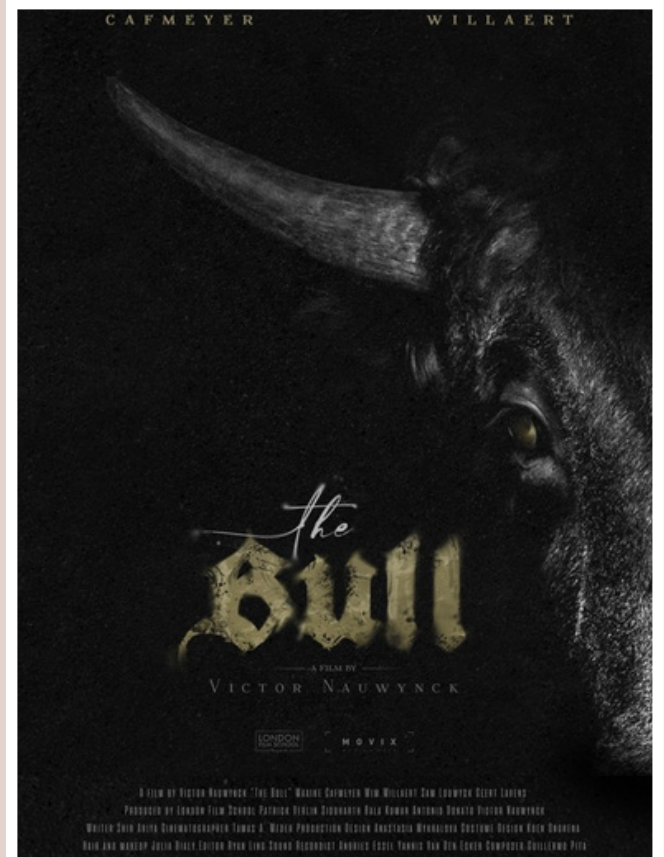
Join us in room P205 to watch a selection of our graduate films from recent years.

Sucking Diesel won the Directorial Discovery Award at Flickers' Rhode Island International Film Festival 2022. It also won Best Comedy Film at San Francisco Frozen Film Festival 2022, and the Silver Screen - Short Film (6 - 30 min) / Film School at Young Director Awards 2022. It has screened on Disney+

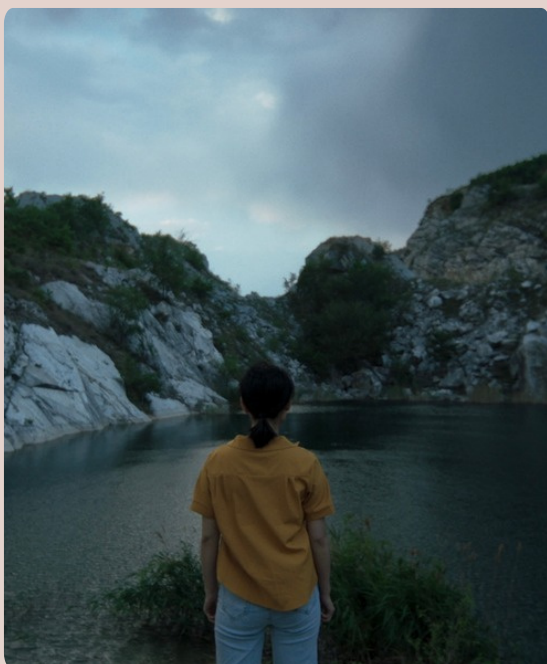


Poet, 2023

Scorched Earth won 2nd Prize at Women In Film and Television Greece Festival 2024. It was also screened at multiple film festivals including Aesthetica Short Film Festival 2023, and Palm Springs International ShortFest 2024.



The Bull, 2023

Cyriel and Marie are a childless married farming couple, whose day to day lives are marked by repetitive and laborious chores. When a highly virile bull is brought onto their farm, the couple's life gets thrown into disarray. While Cyriel is determined to impregnate their cows, Marie develops an unlikely attraction to the bull.

The Bull was screened at multiple film festivals including London Short Film Festival 2025, Leuven International Short Film Festival 2024, Brussels Short Film Festival 2025 and PÖFF Shorts (Black Nights Film Festival) 2024.



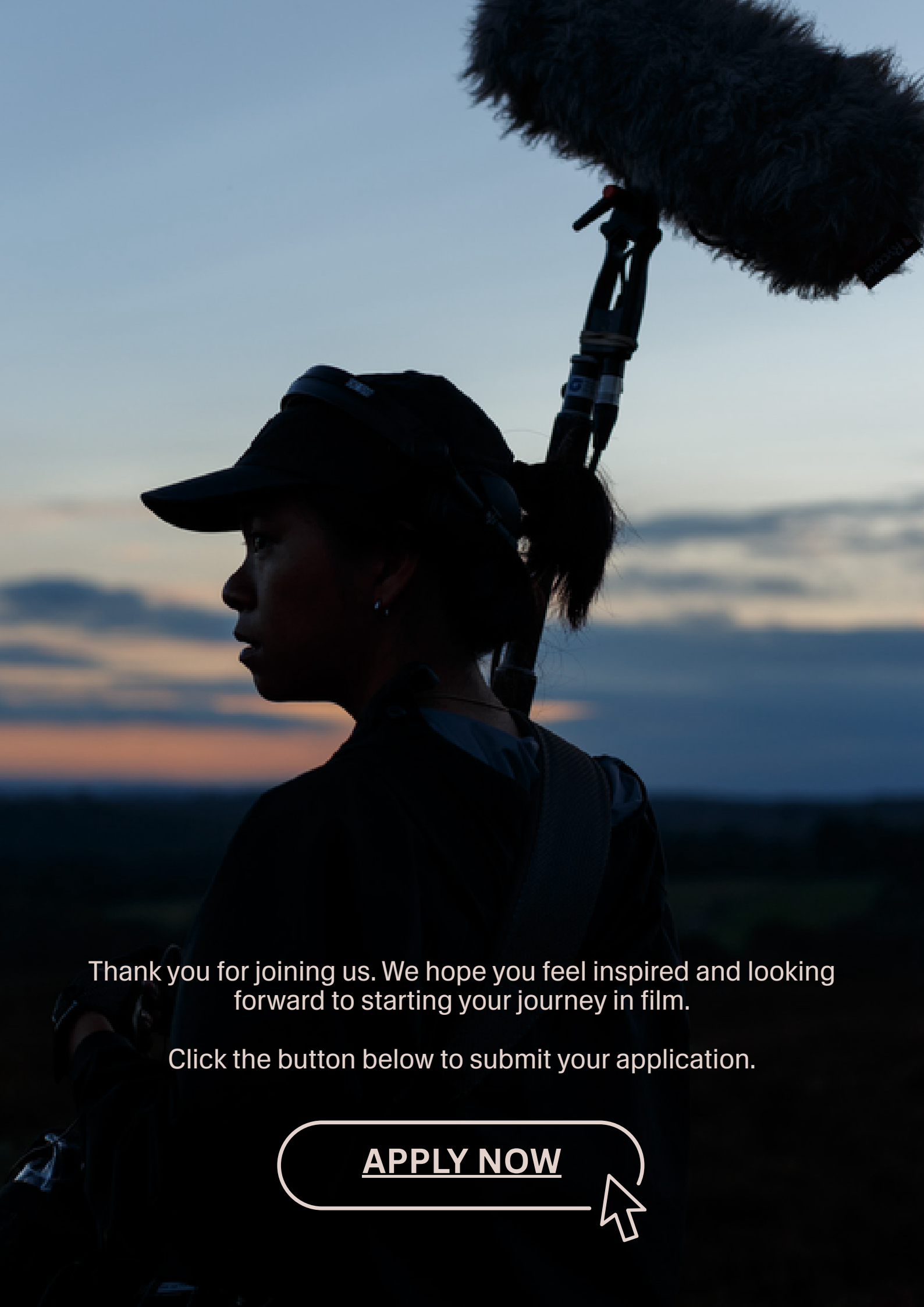
Filipiñana, 2019

This film has just premiered a feature length version under the same title at the Sundance and Berlin Film Festivals 2026. It was acquired by BFI Distribution in May 2026 for theatrical release across the UK and Ireland in the autumn this year.
